



We are all looking forward to 2024 here at the shelter, 2023 has been a challenging year and we are hoping next year will be better. In 2023 our shelter ran at full capacity all year long, as soon as an animal was adopted, more animals were coming in and filling their spots. This has been a huge issue for all shelters across the United States, there are more animals coming into shelters, than there are adoptions, it's been a struggle for most shelters. Many shelters have been operating in crisis mode and are either at capacity or way over capacity....and almost daily you see shelters who had to hang up the 'no vacancy' sign at their facilities. Never before have we received so many calls & emails to surrender animals, most of these calls to surrender are due to evictions & foreclosures, people going into nursing homes and people passing away and they don't have anyone to take care of their animals. We also received many calls from people who are not able to afford their pets anymore due to the rising costs of pet food & veterinary costs. And we had a few large cruelty cases that carried over from 2022 into 2023 in which we had to continue to hold the animals until their case was done ... thus we were fuller than full with our animal population at the shelter.

We experienced an increase in cruelty cases that involve larger numbers of animals and this years kitten season was very busy as we brought in 182 kittens. Luckily, this year we had some great foster families that were able to foster our kittens, several times throughout the year which helped us tremendously. We are happy to report our foster families did an excellent job caring for and socializing our kittens - which helped many of these social butterflies get adopted!! But when you have 182 kittens...and not as many people wanting to adopt...we still have many kittens at our shelter that need homes.

We encourage people to always consider adopting from a shelter - even though we all know there are many animals out there that are advertised 'free to good home' - but it's really not free - as they will need vet care and in times like these it is better and more affordable to adopt from the SPCA. Adoption fees are reasonable and all of our animals are vetted, vaccinated, microchipped, spayed or neutered, de-wormed, flea and tick treated and socialized. And... we can even tell you about their personality and advise you as to which animal would be a good fit. We always say we are committed to finding the best fit for our shelter animals and the best fit for you the adopter... and we mean it!

If you simply cannot adopt a pet, or you are not ready to make the commitment to adopt, you can always help out by stopping in and volunteering or becoming a foster, you can also donate some supplies, treats or toys or sign up to help out at our fundraising events. There are so many ways you can help...and no matter what you choose to do...it all helps to make a difference in animals life!

In looking forward to 2024 - we are hoping more people will be willing to adopt...as every adoption not only helps that 1 animal being adopted, but it opens the door for another animal to be brought in and get the care they need at our shelter. So...when you adopt you are actually helping two animals!! And some good news 2024, is a big year for us and we will be celebrating!! It's hard to believe its been 5 years since we moved into our new shelter and held our grand opening event! Since moving into our new shelter we have adopted out 3,260 animals and we have done over 7,100 spay & neuter surgeries! This year our Theme Basket auction will be our 30th anniversary...and we are already planning for it!!! Stay tuned for info as to how we will be celebrating our 5 years at our new shelter & the 30th Annual Theme Basket Auction. In closing, we would like to thank everyone who has supported us this past year by either adopting, donating or volunteering - we have been in existence since 1911 and we would not have done it without the support of all our animal lovers out there in our community! THANK YOU!



In the fall of 2022, we had an unusual case that involved 27 pot belly pigs living in a camper...and they needed to be immediately removed from the unsanitary situation they were in. We had to think fast on organizing the removal of the pigs and luckily we were able to find some very kind folks to help round up and trailer the pigs...who by the way were squeeling at the top of the lungs. We then found another kind person who let us use their barn to temporarily house all the pigs. Many of you may have seen our story either on Facebook, in the newspaper, on the radio...and they even made it to the Buffalo TV news stations!! As it turned out many of the female potbelly pigs were pregnant and piglets started arriving and our population grew to

45 quickly! It was a first for the SPCA to have 45 potbelly pigs at one time...but to also conduct a pig neuter clinic at our shelter! We want to thank Dr. Alex Navaro of Perry Vet Clinic for coming to our shelter and to our 'rescue' to perform neuters on the young male pigs, and we also want to thank our staff that helped prep our little snorting patients and for providing the TLC needed during their recovery. No doubt it's been an interesting year and a challenge caring for so many pigs...we were sucessful in adopting out 37 piglets & adult pigs! We still have several adult pigs in our care...so if you are interested in adopting or would like to donate to our 'piggy bank' to help feed and take care of our pigs just contact the shelter at 585-593-2200

He came to us in very rough shape, needing extensive dental work and both of his ears were severely infected and swollen shut & very painful for him, his skin and fur was a mess... plus this poor cat was FIV positive too. The scars he wears definitely shows he is "not a fighter, but a lover". Even though his appearance will always reflect the difficult life he endured, we are happy to say Fezz is a friendly tom cat that we were able to nurse back to good health with the help of all the people who donated both money and canned cat food. It took us many months and a lot of patience to work with all of the dogs and to gain their trust, and slowly but surely they started to come out of their shells and their personalities started to emerge. Unfortunately, even though they made great progress with us...when people did come to our shelter and walk over to visit the dogs, most of them would hide by running underneath their dog beds. So, adopting them out was a bit challenging and at times some of the adopters had to come back a few times before these little angels felt comfortable enough to go to their new homes. We are happy to report 16 of the dogs did get adopted and are flourishing in their new homes! We are spotlighting Susie who is now known as Poppy and Wishbone who was recently adopted.

Wishbone came from the case of the 19 dogs had been with us about a year and he just wasn't getting a whole lot of interest, he wasn't a bad dog by any means...but he also did not want to live in a multi-dog or a cat household, which limited his options for adoption. One day we decided to let him hang out at the front desk with our staff to get a little bit more exposure. The first few days he wasn't sure, as he was out of his comfort zone. But despite being nervous...he did great and each day he looked forward to going out front and helping out and he even greeted our visitors. This really opened the door for him as we did a funny post about our new front desk assistant and then we started to get some inquiries on him. His new mom, had lost her dog awhile back and she had seen Wishbone on our website previously, but she just wasn't ready to adopt another dog.... about 6 months later she saw Wishbone still on our website, but also saw his Facebook post and she decided to submit an application. The rest is history....and he has forgotten his past...Wishbone is now doing fantastic, he has confidence, he is not hiding and he is braver, he really likes car rides and even is OK with kids too! We never know who will arrive at our shelter and in what condition they will be in...but we do know they are here for a reason...because they need our help. Far too many times animals arrive at the SPCA in very bad shape, sometimes it is due to an injury or due to neglect or as a result of animal cruelty. They often require immediate medical attention and it's either after hours or on the weekends, thus requiring a trip to the urgent care in Olean or a 24 hour facility a few hours away. This is where the emergency medical fund comes in... and to the 'rescue'. Years ago we had set up an Emergency Fund after we had a case with a house fire and many cats perished in the fire and others were injured and needed continued medical care. Our emergency medical fund has helped so many animals that have come through our doors, and we are thankful for everyone who steps up to donate in order to save a life and change a life forever.

This year we had 3 year old labrador retriever Louis who arrived with two torn ACL's that would require surgery...plus he was 30+ overweight thus affecting him getting around. We started him on a diet with special food for 6 months, along with some hydrotherapy and laser treatments with Dr. Amy Mount before he was able to have his surgeries at the Cornell Veterinary Hospital. Without this Emergency Medical Fund and donors to help along the way we would not have been able to help Louis.

With 2023 almost in the books, it's time for some end of year tax planning. Did you know that the SPCA Serving Allegany County is a non-profit 501c3 tax-exempt charity and we do NOT receive any governmental funding? Our SPCA solely exists due to donations, fundraisers, grants and bequests. SO why not let the SPCA help you save big money this tax season? Donations made to the SPCA are tax deductible and a great way to help the residents and animals of our country. Indeed, there are several advantages to giving the charity including, creating good will, the feeling you get knowing you have made a difference in your community and the personal tax benefits knowing that Uncle Sam is getting just a little bit less from your pocket. Although our friends at the IRS keep a watchful eye on charitable deductions, if you donate to an IRS approved tax-exempt entity such as ours, and keep track of your paperwork, it makes the tax season much easier for you and your tax preparation professional. #### Will my donation stay in Allegany

**County?** ABSOLUTELY, all of the donations to the SPCA Serving Allegany County remain here. Although we are the only SPCA in our county, we are not affiliated with county government at all. We receive no governmental stipends or financial support in any manner and your donations are greatly appreciated as we are totally privately funded by animal loving people just like you.

How much can I donate? Typically, as much as you want! However, please consult your tax professional as certain types of donations can have other implications on your taxes. That being said, there are typically no limits on monetary charitable donations for most tax payers.

What documentation must I keep if I donate to the SPCA Serving Allegany

**County?** For monetary donations above \$250 you must keep a written confirmation from the SPCA that has our name, the date and the amount you gave on it. We are only required to provide these for donations over \$250 and we do just that. If you are giving less than \$250, generally a cancelled check, credit card receipt/ statement or bank record is sufficient to satisfy the IRS.
